## Work Detail Program

### Background

The Oregon Fire Implementation to Restore Ecosystems (OR-FIRE) Partnership is an initiative of The Nature Conservancy supported by public and private funding to expand capacity for prescribed fire planning, implementation, and monitoring.

### Our Vision

The OR-FIRE Partnership supports healthy and resilient ecosystems and fire-adapted communities by creating, training, and deploying inter-organizational, place-based prescribed fire capacity, rooted in a diverse and inclusive fire management culture.

### Detail Program

We are accepting applications from fire practitioners at **all levels** of experience, **individuals or agency-affiliated**, to join a prescribed fire module for a two-week work detail. We have modules in Redmond, Klamath Falls, and Pendleton, OR. Work activities will take place on a variety of landownership types, including US Forest Service lands in the Wildland Urban Interface, and may cover a range of fire-related duties.

We welcome fire practitioners who are new to fire as well as those who have some more experience. If you are advancing your fire qualifications through NWCG taskbooks, there will be opportunities to work on those, especially FFT1, ENGB, and FEMO. Open taskbooks are *not* a requirement for this detail opportunity, as there will also be ample opportunities to provide mentorship and training to newer fire practitioners. Some financial assistance is available to help with time and travel expenses.
