2026 UPDATES

»»» APRIL 24 - EARTH DAY

On April 24th, the Pit River Tribe and community came together to celebrate Earth Day in Burney and Alturas. With a day full of connection, culture, and appreciation for our land, nearly 20 vendors joined us to share goods and resources, while community members enjoyed food, conversation, and time together. The event was a meaningful reminder of the importance of caring for our environment and honoring the natural resources that sustain us. »»» MAY 5 - MMIP PRAYER WALK

On the National Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls (MMIWG), the Pit River Tribe MMIP Department hosted its 2nd Annual MMIP Prayer Walk in Burney, California. The event brought together over 250 community members, families, Tribal leadership, advocates, and supporters in honor of Missing and Murdered Indigenous People and to raise awareness about the ongoing MMIP crisis impacting Tribal communities across the nation. The event was made possible through collaboration with the Fall River Joint Unified School District, Pit River Tribe Victim Services, Pit River Behavioral Health, and Pit River Health Services. Together, the departments helped support a meaningful day centered on remembrance, healing, unity, and justice for Indigenous families affected by the MMIP crisis.

All Tribal members will vote for Tribal Officers, Pit River Health Service Board members and Pit River Housing Board members.

This year, the Four Corners Occupation Event will be held on Saturday, October 10, 2026. The event will place special focus on the 583.79 acres of Four Corners land scheduled to be placed into Trust this year. GRANT UPDATES

PIT RIVER TRIBE RECEIVES YOUTH SERVICE CORPS AWARD FOR YOUTH WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

The Pit River Tribe was awarded \$372,104.48 for a one-year Youth Service Corps Program focused on recruiting, training, and employing four youth ages 16–30 in food sovereignty, climate resilience, and land stewardship efforts. Based in Alturas, CA, the program will leverage the Tribe's existing 10-acre greenhouse to strengthen workforce development and long-term community resilience.



INDIGENOUS STEWARDSHIP NETWORK GRANT ADVANCES CULTURAL FIRE ON XL

The Pit River Tribe was awarded \$100,000 through the Indigenous Stewardship Network Grant Program to support cultural burning activities on XL Ranch. The project will support band-led cultural burns, hands-on workforce training, and intergenerational knowledge transfer while restoring native plant communities, improving landscape resilience, and reducing wildfire risk.

PIT RIVER TRIBE RECEIVES NDN COLLECTIVE FUNDING FOR FOUR CORNERS LAND TRANSFER LEGISLATIVE ACTION

The Tribe was awarded \$12,792 from NDN Collective to support legislative action efforts for the Four Corners Land Transfer. Funding will advance project-related federal coordination, consultation and advocacy activities including lobbying for the trust-to-trust land transfer.
